The Ph.D. in Educational Policy, Planning, & Leadership with a concentration in Curriculum & Educational Leadership prepares specialists, leaders, and researchers with expert, contextualized knowledge of curriculum development, learning design, and K-12 school and division leadership. Drawing from disciplines of curriculum, teaching, learning, assessment, sociocultural perspectives, and organizational theory, the doctorate in Curriculum & Educational Leadership will equip you with the knowledge and skills to successfully meet the challenges that face K-12 education today and in the future.

FAST FACTS

Designed for: Teachers, school leaders and other educational professionals seeking leadership and teaching roles in academic and professional settings

Prerequisite: Master's degree in education or related field

Coursework: 69 credit hours minimum. Most courses are offered on campus and in the evening to accommodate working professionals. Part-time and full-time options available.

Entry term: Fall

Fieldwork: Fieldwork is integrated into coursework and the 9-credit dissertation. Participation in the community of scholars through on-campus co-curricular opportunities, faculty-directed research projects, and professional conferences is strongly promoted.

TAILORED EXPERIENCES

Throughout the program, real-world experiences allow students to study at the intersection of theory and practice.

Cognate: In consultation with their advisors, students select and design a 9-credit cognate area to broaden and deepen their knowledge base and specialize their studies. Cognates include (but are not limited to) learning design, gifted education, higher education, and applied inquiry. Students typically work with their advisors to develop unique cognates aligned to past experiences and future goals.

Dissertation: Ph.D. students develop their own line of research with the help of a faculty advisor, culminating in a dissertation experience supervised by a committee of three or more faculty members chosen by the student.
