 A text set is a collection of texts (e.g. novels, passages, articles, short stories, film, art, websites, etc.) organized around a central universal theme/idea.





The Assignment

Text Set Activity 1

Step 1

Create a page in your OneNote folder under "Text Set" and label it Text Set 1

Step 2 - Headline

Create a headline on the topic of your text set (e.g., The Psychology of Crime, Love, and Betrayal, etc.). This topic comes from your weekly reading reflection form – 'I wonder...' and 'Topic I wish to learn more about...' REMEMBER it is only one topic that you will be researching.

Step 3 - Research

Research your topic and find three (3) articles that address your issue. Make sure you hyperlink the links on your page.

Step 4 - Analysis

You will write three paragraphs -

- 1. Informing the reader how the novel/article you read or are reading helped you generate the topic. You may also select a topic we have discussed in class.
- 2. Informing the reader about your topic. Provide specific details; remember the reader is the dumbest person in the world.
- 3. An analysis of why this topic should be important to the reader.

Step 5 – Work Cited

You must have a work cited section in your text set. You must use MLA format (you have the format in your quarterly portfolio packet). The format is also available at https://owl.english.purdue.edu/

Analysis

Natasha Peterson's novel, Awake, deals with an adolescent who has four years of her life erased after a traumatic event. Years later, after another dramatic event, she begins to get pieces of her memory back. Unfortunately, she is not sure if these visions are dreams or real events. This issue made me reflect on how can the brain forget things. What were the actual causes? Fear, trauma, or nerve damage?

According to HelpGuide.org, there are various reasons for memory loss. It could be caused by diseases, drug toxins, depression, vitamin deficiencies, and psychological trauma. According to Kerry Williams, teenage memory loss can be caused by the same incidents listed above. However, due to the nature of an adolescent brain, "memory loss from head trauma typically won't worsen but will stay the same or improve" (Williams). If the head trauma is compounded with an emotional situation, the brain will develop memory loss that may remain permanent (Williams). The psyche will try to subdue the trauma.

It is important that the general population understand the importance of this topic, particularly when a young adult is diagnosed. It is crucial to comprehend the pressures teenagers go through and how important memories are to their understanding of who they are. For this reason, it is important that adolescents suffering from this condition are provided with adequate medical and psychological treatments.
