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Students who major in French, German, Hispanic Studies, Classical Studies/Latin concentration may become certified to teach in preK-12 schools. (Non-majors may qualify for the foreign language education program by completing 30 semester hours above the intermediate level in one of the languages listed above.) Subject area coursework in the foreign language for majors and non-majors shall include study of the language at advanced levels, courses in linguistics, grammar/composition, culture (inclusive of history and geography), and literature.

Students are encouraged to qualify for endorsements in two languages by majoring in one, and taking at least 24 hours in a second language.
