Yi Hao, a doctoral candidate, recently co-authored an article published in *Innovative Higher Education*. In "Are They Worth it?: Master's Degrees and Labor Market Outcomes," the authors used the 2013 *National Survey of College Graduates* to explore annual earning potential, primary work activity and education-job match of STEM bachelor's degree holders and master's degree completion. The results of their work illustrated that there is a considerable pay gap between men and

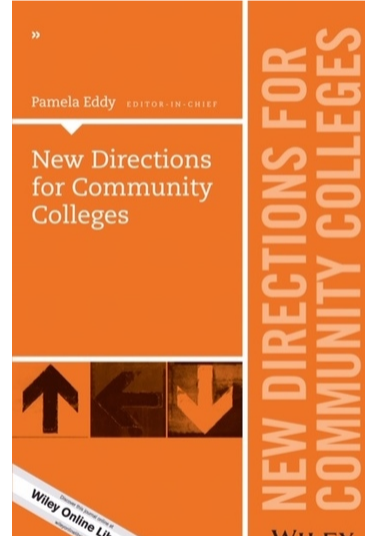
