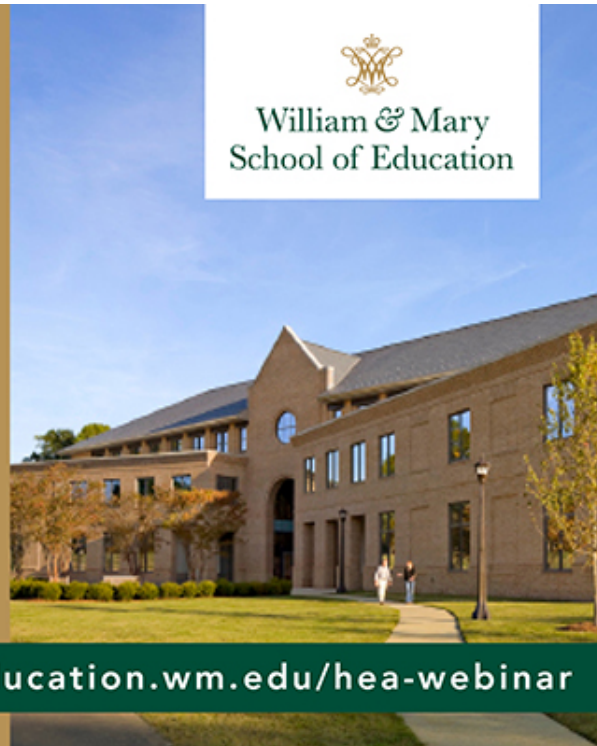

Book Talk with Drs. Pamela Eddy and James Barber

On November 17, Dr. Pamela Eddy, Professor of Higher Education and Dr. Jim Barber, Associate Professor of Education, hosted a virtual book talk. Dr. Eddy discussed her book titled “***Leading for Tomorrow: A Primer for Succeeding in Higher Education Leadership.***” She expected that this book would help readers reflect on their own leadership and communication styles. Dr. Barber shared the writing process of his book titled “***Facilitating the Integration of Learning: Five Research-Based Practices to Help College Students Connect Learning Across Disciplines and Lived Experience.***” He hopes that his book will assist readers in using practical and real-world strategies for facilitating students’ integration of learning. Given the uncertainty caused by the global pandemic, Dr. Eddy and Dr. Barber shared their hope that the books would enhance educational practice and facilitate meaningful dialogue around the challenges facing higher education. 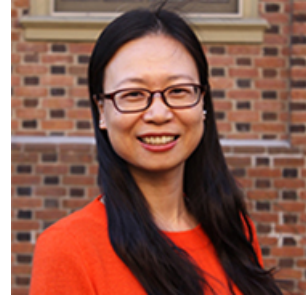
