William & Mary's Executive Ed.D. programs offer an alternative to the traditional delivery model for the doctorate degree without sacrificing the quality education historically associated with William & Mary. The concentration in International School Leadership is fully online, allowing students to participate from anywhere in the world. The program features a focus on the human aspects of leadership, including cross-cultural and intercultural leadership knowledge, skills and attributes.

**Designed for:** Teachers, administrators and other educators seeking leadership roles in schools and other educational settings

**Prerequisite:** Master's degree in education or related field, who are currently serving or seeking administrative roles

### **CONTENT CORE**

The Executive Ed.D. offers a scholarly-practitioner model which resides at the intersection of theory, inquiry and practice. Coursework and research complement students' professional practice and is enriched by deep collaboration with the expert community of practitioner-scholars within each cohort.

**Policy:** How do leaders analyze and formulate educational policies? Who are the key players in the making of education policy on the world stage?

**Planning:** How do global leaders determine present status, envision future direction, chart a course of action, and assess progress?

**Leadership:** What knowledge, skills, and dispositions are required of effective leaders in contemporary educational settings?
