Become a bold educational leader.

William & Mary's Executive Ed.D. programs offer an alternative to the traditional delivery model for the doctorate degree without sacrificing the quality education historically associated with William & Mary. Courses are taught primarily by regular School of Education faculty members, in a format that better meets the needs of working practitioners. A focus on excellence, equity and school reform prepares graduates to lead transformative innovation and be agents of change in schools and communities.

Designed for: Teachers, administrators, school psychologists and other educators seeking leadership roles in schools and other educational settings

Concentrations: Gifted Administration, Higher Education Administration, International School Leadership, K-12 Administration

Prerequisite: Master's degree in education or related

Coursework: 51 credit hours, typically completed in three years

Entry term: Summer

Format: Hybrid (concentrations in Gifted, K-12 and Higher Education Administration) and fully online (concentration in International School Leadership)

CULMINATING EXPERIENCES

The Executive Ed.D. offers a scholarly-practitioner model which resides at the intersection of theory, inquiry and practice. Coursework and research complement students' professional practice and is enriched by deep collaboration with the expert community of practitioner-scholars within each cohort.

Dissertation: The program is designed to integrate dissertation preparation and content into regular coursework. With faculty support and collaboration from classmates, you'll develop your own line of research and solve a problem of practice that's related to your experience, interests and aspirations.

CONCENTRATION AREAS

Beginning with the second summer residency, students specialize their degree in one of four concentrations: Gifted Education, Higher Education Administration, K-12 Administration or International School Leadership. All students also take a course on leadership for social justice, equity and excellence and a research seminar.

DISSERTATION STUDY

In the final fall and spring semesters, students pursue a dissertation centered around a problem of professional practice.
