Role Title: Licensed Practical Nurse (49111)

Position Summary:

The Camp Nurse will provide appropriate assessment and oversee treatment of medical problems in the Camp Launch student community. The Camp Nurse will review all medical files on students to ensure they take their medication at the appropriate times and are always available in the event of an emergency. Shifts are 8 hours (or 12 hours) for 14 days July 13-26, 2025. The Camp Nurse may be required to stay in the dorm. The Camp Nurse will present on clinical protocols and universal precautions at the Counselors' Orientation. The Camp Nurse will assist development of a medical policies and procedures and additional documents, as needed. Also, the Camp Nurse will treat students for medical issues, help prevent physical issues and disease.

Required Qualifications:

Graduate from an accredited U.S. Nursing program with an RN or LPN license in good standing with the Commonwealth of Virginia

Preferred Qualifications:

Clinical experience in a related medical/clinical setting or in a public-school system

Conditions of Employment:

- Shifts are 8 hours or 12 hours per day for 14 days July 13-26, 2025
- This position is a temporary (hourly) position not to exceed 6 months. All hourly employees are subject to the limitations of the Virginia Manpower Control Program and total hours worked may not exceed on average 29 hours per week, over the course of a twelve-month period beginning May 1 each year.
- This is a non-exempt position, eligible to receive overtime in accordance with the Fair Labor Standards Act. This position may be subject to overtime during high peak times, etc. as directed and approved by the supervisor.

JOB DUTIES

80% Patient Care

- Provide appropriate assessment and treatment of medical problems in the residential Camp Launch Program
- Maintain appropriate universal precautions at all times in handling patient specimens and any potentially contaminated materials.
- Strive for personal excellence in the specific skills and knowledge required for professional expertise.
- Responsible for professional, first-aid medical treatment of students.
- Responsible for early detection of physical problems and health evaluations.
- Maintains clinical records.
- Communicate with CL staff to ensure the safety and well-being of students.

- Administer medications and monitor delegated medication administration.
- Provides emergency aid to students and camp staff.
- Communicate with parents as needed to inform and/or to get permission for students' medical treatment.

5% Interpersonal/Team Responsibilities

- Demonstrates high standards of integrity, confidentiality, and professionalism.
- Demonstrates a positive, open-minded, "can-do" attitude and willingness/enthusiasm to effect change.
- Supports a collaborative, professional work environment. When any kind of unforeseen treatment is given, communicate with the parents about what happened and what they did to treat their child.

10% Other Clinical Nursing Responsibilities

- Review health evaluation forms of entering students for completeness. Abide by OSHA Standards to ensure continued compliance with the mandated BBP regulations.

- Provide pertinent education for students' current condition and general health concerns in a manner that facilitates understanding.
