Parking and Directions

301 Monticello Ave., Williamsburg, VA

From Richmond and points west:

- Take Interstate 64 East to exit 234 (Route 199 East) towards Lightfoot.
- Follow Route 199 approximately 6 miles to the Monticello Avenue exit.
- At the bottom of the ramp, turn left at the stop light onto Monticello Avenue.
- Stay on Monticello Avenue for approximately 1.5 miles. At the sixth light, you'll see a large sign on the right for the School of Education. Turn right at the light.
- Turn into the first parking lot on your left. Park in Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 or 8. Be sure to display your parking permit.

From Norfolk and points east:

- Take Interstate 64 West to exit 242A (Route 199 West) towards Williamsburg and Jamestown.
- Follow Route 199 approximately 6 miles to the Monticello Avenue exit.
- At the bottom of the ramp, bear to the right onto Monticello Avenue.
- Stay on Monticello Avenue for approximately 1.5 miles. At the sixth light, you'll see a large sign on the right for the School of Education. Turn right at the light.
- Turn into the first parking lot on your left. Park in Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 or 8. Be sure to display your parking permit.

All motor vehicles parked on College property must display a permit authorized by Parking Services. The permit is invalid if any information has been omitted. Please write in your name and license plate information, and place the pass on the drivers' side dashboard facing out.

- This pass is valid for: Lots 1-8 permit parking located to the front of the School of Education Building.
- This pass is **not** valid for: visitor, carpool, service vehicle, "reserved for officials" or metered/timed parking spaces.
 - Handicap parking is available, but guests with a handicap hang-tag/plate must still display a temporary guest parking permit.

Parking in any other area on campus will be subject to citation. Riding, driving or parking any vehicle on sidewalks or grounds of the College is prohibited. William and Mary police will enforce moving violations, which will be returnable in the respective District Courts. In all cases, the directions of a police officer supersede the regulations posted by sign or signal. William and Mary Police and Parking Services are authorized to remove, at the owner's expense, any vehicle which is in violation of these regulations. This includes towing and/or wheel locking. Acceptance of permit attests that a person understands the traffic and parking regulations and accepts responsibility to adhere to them.
