Virginia's Revolutionary histories take center stage at 'For 2026' conference

The Omohundro Institute of Early American History & Culture, in collaboration with William & Mary and The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, is thrilled to announce the upcoming "Virginia's Revolutionary Histories & Beyond" conference scheduled for October 25-26, 2024.

A preconference day dedicated to K-12 teachers and museum educators is scheduled on October 24. The Revolutionary Educators (RevED) Teacher Summit, a convening of K-12 teachers, teacher educators and museum and historic site educators, will share strategies for interdisciplinary pedagogical practices. Topics range from civic engagement to the responsible use of AI in teaching history.

Also featured is the third annual convening of the Slate Seminar, a symposium to share the history and legacies of the Williamsburg Bray School and the students who studied there. This year marks 250 years since the August 1774 closing of the school. **More.**

Summer Kirkpatrick M.Ed. '24 Organizes Collections for Hurricane Helene Storm Relief

A local school counselor and School of Education alum drew many donations, earning headlines for her dedication in the "Virginia Gazette":

The community came out in force Friday to donate items for storm relief to North Carolina, both at Walsingham Academy and at Williamsburg Presbyterian Church — collection drives spurred by Summer Kirkpatrick.

By Saturday morning, four trucks left at 5 a.m. to make their way to the flood-ravaged western North Carolina, part of the area affected by the remnants of Hurricane Helene.

Kirkpatrick, a school counselor at Walsingham Academy, organized the drives to help the town where she once lived and still owns a house. Her husband, Reid, took a first U-Haul load there a week ago, adding to supplies being collected at Black Mountain Presbyterian Church. By this past Saturday, the church's storage was full, so supplies were directed to a warehouse in nearby Swannanoa, where they'll be distributed as needed. **More**.
