W&M School of Education advances to top 50 in national rankings

In the latest U.S. News & World Report rankings of best graduate schools released in April, the William & Mary School of Education advanced to the top 50 in the nation, jumping nearly 10 spots from the previous year to 49th. Earlier this year, U.S. News also ranked the school 33rd for best online master's in education programs for veterans.

"Our faculty and students are driving innovation through impactful scholarship, community partnerships and a deep commitment to providing equitable access to education," said W&M School of Education Dean Robert C. Knoeppel. "This ranking is a clear testament to the success of our faculty in delivering programs that serve the Commonwealth and producing research and scholarship of consequence that improves outcomes for children, families and communities." **More.**
