

Williamsburg at a Glance

Williamsburg, Jamestown and Yorktown form what is known as the Historic Triangle. In 1607, the first permanent English settlement in North America was founded at Jamestown when Captain John Smith and a band of pioneer settlers established a beachhead colony. Facing unanticipated hardships and challenges, the settlers were not quickly accepted by the Powhatan Indians, who were curious about their new neighbors' intentions. For the next ninety years, Jamestown served as the seat of government for the English colonies as they steadily grew in population. In 1693, King William III and Queen Mary II granted a charter to establish a college in the Virginia colony at a new location known locally as Middle Plantation. Although the new college (appropriately named the College of William & Mary) was established as the second educational institution in the new colonies, William & Mary's antecedents actually predate those of Harvard. A 330-acre tract of land was purchased for 170 pounds, and the College of Arms in London granted the College of William & Mary a coat of arms in 1694.

In 1698, the statehouse in Jamestown burned for the fourth time, and many Virginians decided to use the opportunity to move the capital to Middle Plantation, including several leading politicians who lived in Middle Plantation. As a rapidly growing city filled with successful tobacco planters and merchants, Middle Plantation possessed many attractive characteristics from its healthier location on high ground between two major waterways to its safety from naval cannon fire. In 1699, the city was given an entirely new layout fitting of a capital and renamed Williamsburg in honor of King William III. The Wren Building became the temporary meeting place for the General Assembly until 1704, when the Capitol Building was sufficiently constructed.

During this time, William & Mary was expanded from its original grammar and Indian schools to include additional buildings and a larger curriculum. By 1729, a president and six full partners were in full use. In 1749, a young George Washington received a commission as surveyor from the College, and in 1756 the first known degree, as well as honorary degree of Master of Arts, was conferred upon Benjamin Franklin. In the colonies, William & Mary was well known for its prestige, and many aristocrats found the bustling town of Williamsburg to be the perfect place to send their children for an education. From 1760 through 1762, Thomas Jefferson attended the College, and after graduation remained in Williamsburg to study law. James Monroe attended the College from 1774 through 1776, during a time when many students formed a College militia company to fight in the Revolution. During the Revolutionary War, the capital of Virginia was moved to Richmond for the same reasons as it had been moved before. Richmond offered a more central location, a healthier climate, and a more defensible position. However, the Williamsburg area remained a significant location for trade and commerce, making it an appealing military target.

In 1781, the American and French defeated General Cornwallis and his British troops at neighboring Yorktown in the last major battle of the Revolutionary War. Although the capital moved to Richmond, Williamsburg did not die. Because of William & Mary and the public hospital, Williamsburg continued

to survive through renovations and a strong local farming market. Both continued to make their mark on history in various ways. In 1776, Phi Beta Kappa was founded at the College. While Governor of Virginia, Jefferson helped convert William & Mary to a university, where an elective system of studies was introduced. This marked the first such program of studies in the United States, including the first law school.

In 1788, George Washington became the first chancellor of William & Mary, serving for eleven years until his death. Because of this, it is interesting to note that Washington's first and last offices were affiliated with William & Mary. Following in his footsteps to hold the esteemed position of chancellor were fourth President of the United States John Tyler, and Chief Justice of the Supreme Court Warren Burger. Margaret, The Lady Thatcher, former Prime Minister of Great Britain, served as Chancellor of the College from 1993-2000. Former U.S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger is currently serving as Chancellor of the College. In 1926, John D. Rockefeller Jr. listened to the vision of a local clergyman, the Reverend W. A. R. Goodwin, who was inspired by both the role Williamsburg played in our nation's birth and by the large number of 18th century buildings that had survived the test of time. Rockefeller gave the vision his support, and the reconstruction of Williamsburg was underway. When visitors walk through the streets of Colonial Williamsburg, they retrace the steps of George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Patrick Henry, and Thomas Jefferson as they ran the colonies and formed a new nation.

Today, Williamsburg boasts a wide variety of attractions and stores that range from modern day to old-world charm. Tourists flock from all parts of the globe to explore and relive what was once a fledgling nation's seat of government. Williamsburg is located midway between Richmond and Norfolk, Virginia along the I-64 corridor. The city of Williamsburg encompasses 9.2 square miles and has a population of 11,400. The climate of Williamsburg is moderate, with an average temperature of 61.3 degrees and an average annual rainfall of 48.07 inches.

There are three major airports within driving distance of Williamsburg. Expect fewer available flights and higher fares during peak tourist season (late spring, summer, early fall, and around Christmas).

Williamsburg has a lot of amazing things to offer. Though there is a lot to do, there are also a lot of great cities nearby to explore as well! Check out these different places and some of the hidden gems within them!

Hampton, Virginia (about 40 minutes from campus)

Established in 1610, Hampton is one of America's oldest cities and is also one of the fastest growing cities in the region...a city on the move! With many fun spots such as Oozlefinch Brewery, Bull Island Brewing, and Sly Clyde Cidery, you're sure to find something you like. Also, be sure to check out Fort Monroe, which holds the narrative of the American story including Captain John Smith's journeys, a haven of freedom for the enslaved during the Civil War, and a bastion of defense for the Chesapeake Bay.

Newport News, Virginia (about 35 minutes from campus)

The city runs approximately 23 miles along the James River and the Hampton Roads Harbor. Steeped in history, ours is a community of diverse trades including shipbuilding, technological research and international commerce. NN is also home to Christopher Newport University, Patrick Henry Mall, and many local restaurants.

Norfolk, Virginia (about an hour from campus)

Norfolk is home to intriguing historical attractions, world-class museums, delicious restaurants, and unique retail shops. Visitors will find it easy to reach all that Norfolk VA has to offer; most places are within a short walking distance or drive! Cruise the beautiful harbor on the tall ship American Rover or tour the city by foot, on bike, or light rail. Along with a wide variety of sports like hockey and baseball, you will find interactive fun both indoors & out at places like the Virginia Zoo, Norfolk Botanical Garden and Nauticus, to name a few! If nightlife is your thing, Norfolk also has a lot of great restaurants and bars to choose from!

Richmond, Virginia (about 45 minutes from campus)

This region is a great big outdoor playground. Whether you want to take a slow bike ride by the river down the Virginia Capital Trail, or take on the class III and IV rapids of the James (which go right through downtown, by the way) – the Richmond region will get your heart pumping. Richmond also has a great art scene. Between street murals, galleries, the VMFA and the Institute for Contemporary Art, you'll feel the creative culture everywhere. And of course, you'll want to take some notes from our Eat section, and find out why it's been named one of the best foodie towns in America. Sample your way through the Richmond Beer Trail and you'll quickly understand why it's earned acclaim as an international destination for craft beer. The Richmond region has about a million stories, from "Give me liberty or give me death" to "Jefferson designed

the Capitol and lived there.” Between museums, outdoor adventures, shopping, and the food scene, you’re sure to have a packed weekend if you visit!

Virginia Beach, Virginia (about an hour from campus)

Deciding among the options is the challenge. The waters of the Atlantic Ocean and the Chesapeake Bay are obvious draws, but swimming and beach time is just the beginning. Virginia Beach offers a variety of music and arts venues, a dozen public golf courses, miles and miles of hiking and biking paths, and our ever-growing Town Center is a gathering place offering dining, shopping and the 1,300 seat Sandler Center for the Performing Arts. The Virginia Museum of Contemporary Art explores the significant art of our time with changing exhibitions from national and international artists, just minutes from the oceanfront. And for an up-close look at the amazing world of underwater life off our shores, the Virginia Aquarium and Marine Science Center is 700,000 gallons of mystery and entertainment. All of these great things to do can be accompanied by tons of delicious restaurants. So be sure to add this to your weekend getaway bucket list!

Yorktown, Virginia (about 20 minutes from campus)

Immerse yourself in an area as rich in American history as it is modern-day charm. Travel back to 1781 and walk in the footsteps of our nation’s Founders at Colonial National Historical Park, or explore our interactive exhibitions at the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown. From art shows and wine festivals to our farmer’s market and outdoor concerts—there’s always something to do in Yorktown. Each season offers unique opportunities to gather as a community and enjoy food, fireworks, music, and entertainment for all ages. You can even take the Colonial Parkway from Williamsburg to get here!
